Make a creative tri-fold that profiles your person, highlighting their accomplishments and impact so as to draw us into your more specific data. Eye-pleasing design should draw visitors to your table. Incorporate the best, perhaps even all, of your projects from this year in your display. Play music or a video or a newsreel perhaps. Offer food treats. At trade shows, vendors usually offer some goodie to take-away – bookmark, pin, business card, hair clip, keychain, brochure, flyer, etc. Be creative. Think outside the trifold...

Trifold must have

- Name & Dates of Your Person
- Iconic Images & Representative Text
- Summary Statement of Your Person’s Importance
- Your Name and Period

Of course, the trifold is the billboard for your table and your table is where you will interact with visitors who will evaluate your presentation. Impress us with your thoughtful insight and comprehensive knowledge of your person. (*Hint: You might want to correct or revise some of your previous projects.*)

Table Display must have

- Trifold (obviously)
- At least 6 projects
- Annotated Bibliography
- Some Takeaway, Souvenir, Manipulative, Memento...

For extra credit you can dress up as your person (must be accurate) or design a t-shirt with a catchy, relevant slogan and/or illustration.

Be prepared to be in “character” and able to answer questions for the entire two hours -- **any** questions. You **will** be asked questions by at least two visitors (Ms. Masterman & Ms. Effinger). We will be observing your interactions with visitors who will fill out review sheets.
