#### The White Man's Burden

This famous poem was written as a response to the American takeover of the Philippines after the Spanish-American War. In it, Kipling encourages the Americans to take up the "burden" of "civilizing" indigenous peoples that had largely been the "responsibility" of the British Empire until then.

Take up the White Man's burden—Send forth the best ye breed—Go bind your sons to exile To serve your captives' need; To wait in heavy harness, On fluttered folk and wild—Your new-caught, sullen peoples, Half-devil and half-child.

Take up the White Man's burden—In patience to abide,
To veil the threat of terror
And check the show of pride;
By open speech and simple,
An hundred times made plain
To seek another's profit,
And work another's gain.

Take up the White Man's burden—
The savage wars of peace—
Fill full the mouth of Famine
And bid the sickness cease;
And when your goal is nearest
The end for others sought,
Watch sloth and heathen Folly
Bring all your hopes to nought.
