Sherlock Holmes: The Great Detective

Research Questions:

- 1. Although created over a century ago, Sherlock Holmes is as popular today as he was a hundred years ago. What is it about the character of Sherlock Holmes that makes him so enduring?
- 2. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle attended medical school and had a small medical practice before he turned to writing full time. How did Conan Doyle's years as a medical student influence the character of Sherlock Holmes?
- 3. Sherlock Holmes is a product of the late 19th century, a time when science and medicine were given great credence. How did the scientific discoveries of the era influence Conan Doyle and his creation, Sherlock Holmes?
- 4. How was Sherlock Holmes the product of Victorian England? How might his character be different if he was created in a different era?
- 5. How did class distinctions influence the interpretation of crime in Victorian England? Do these assumptions continue today? If so, how?
- 6. How did the unsolved mystery of Jack the Ripper escalate the popularity of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's work?
- 7. What was the role of drugs in Sherlock Holmes's crime solving?
- 8. Why is Sir Arthur Conan Doyle referred to as "the godfather of the crime story?"

Extended Activities

- 1. Write a short, modern crime story with Sherlock Holmes as the detective. How would Holmes make use of the advances in technology that have occurred in the twentieth century?
- 2. Create a mobile that demonstrates the tools Sherlock Holmes used in his profession.
